"Strenghtening the general practitioners and nurses of Paramaribo in dealing with violence against children"




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Background

Suriname is a developing country in south America plagued by corruption and poverty. 600.000 people live in Suriname of which 200.000 children. Child abuse is a major problem in Suriname. Regionally Suriname is second to Jamaica in victims of child abuse (figure 1)¹. According to figures from 2017², in Suriname at least 70.000 children become victims of violence every year. Unfortunately, the majority of these victims never receive the guidance and therapy they need. Research shows that children who remain in violent situations have an increased risk of poor school performance, committing suicide and developing chronic diseases such as cardiovascular disease and certain types of cancer later in life³. In the district Paramaribo there are approximately 200,000 inhabitants, of which 20,000 are children. The general practitioners and nurses of this district are trying to implement better care but lack the training in dealing timely and effectively with child abuse. This pilot project aims to empower these health professionals and in so doing improve the systems response to child abuse. This is one of the main goals of the Kibos foundation ⁴.

Objectives

Primary objective:

- Organise a 1 day seminar with the aim of equipping 75 professionals of the police force and the educational system living and working in the districts of Paramaribo. Technically, the whole is assisted by a multidisciplinary team consisting of a child abuse paediatrician, a nurse, a child and youth psychologist and two social workers, all affiliated with the Kibos foundation. The <u>75 participants</u> will be trained in:
 - What the short and long-term effects of child abuse are
 - How to recognize and document the physical symptoms of child abuse
 - What to do with children who exhibit problematic sexual behaviour
 - Culture sensitive communication when having suspicions of child abuse
 - Referral system in cases of child abuse

Secondary objective:

- 2. Form a cohort (using objective 1) for follow-up on these professionals.
- 3. Extrapolate data from 1 and 2 to make reliable correlations between the number of trained professionals and the timely management of child abuse in the districts Wanica and Para in Suriname.

Management structure and procedures

Risks

1. Stakeholder Engagement: Engaging key stakeholders, general practitioners and nurses is crucial for the success of the pilot study. Ensuring their buy-in, collaboration, and support will facilitate the smooth implementation of the project and pave the way for potential future scaling.

Mitigation strategies

1. Stakeholder Engagement:

a. Identify and engage key stakeholders early on.

b. Organize regular meetings to update stakeholders and gather their input.

c. Actively document and share the learnings and challenges encountered during the pilot study. This will contribute to scaling up of the program in the near future.

Impact

The impact of a pilot project in strengthening health professionals in Paramaribo can be significant in several ways:

1. Early Detection and Treatment: The pilot project allows for the early detection of cases of child abuse or children with problematic sexual behaviour. By identifying individuals at an early stage, appropriate treatment and management strategies can be initiated promptly. Early detection can potentially reduce the morbidity and mortality associated with child abuse, improving the overall health outcomes of affected individuals. In total the approximately **20.000 children** living in the district Paramaribo will benefit indirectly from this pilot project.

2. Capacity Building: The pilot project offers an opportunity to build local capacity in early detection and timely referral in cases of child abuse. This

capacity-building aspect contributes to the long-term sustainability in the management of child abuse in Suriname.

3. Policy and Advocacy: The findings and recommendations from the pilot project can inform policy development and advocacy efforts related to the prevention, detection and management of child abuse in Suriname. In the future we hope to install a child advocacy center in this district.
